Ministry Announcement

August 13th - Minister announced:

- Boards can access reserves to address class size, HVAC and leased space;
- Allocation based funding for staffing;
- New guidelines for remote learning;











Ministry Follow-up

- August 14th Ministry advises guide is baseline, districts can make adaptations that support more physical distancing and other health and safety measures provided:
 - In-person classes for elementary school students five days per week;
 - Full instructional hours for all students;
 - Option for remote learning for all students in the 2020-21 school year;
 - Focus on cohorting and limiting student contacts per the guidance memo; and
 - Adapted secondary school delivery for designated boards.











Remote Learning

Minutes of synchronous learning and instruction are now mandated:

Division	Grade Level of Students	Daily Minimum Synchronous Learning Time Requirement*
Elementary	Kindergarten	180 minutes
	Grades 1 to 3	225 minutes
	Grades 4 to 8	225 minutes
Secondary	Grades 9 to 12	The higher of 60 minutes for each 75-minute class period** or 225 minutes per day for a full course schedule

^{*} This is in addition to asynchronous learning time.











^{**} The synchronous learning time requirement for any period that is not 75 minutes should be adjusted to reflect this ratio.

Implications of Remote Learning Regulation

- Dedicated teachers and principals;
- Creation of "virtual schools";
- Remote students not connected to community school for learning activities;
- Reduces fluidity between models;
- Student transitions likely at change of semester only;
- Reorganization of schools for in person learning.











Funding for Additional Staffing

- The provincial total of \$30 million has been allocated to boards by the ministry rather than on an application process.
- The OCDSB allocation will be \$1.3 million











Ventilation

- Awaiting details, of allocation of most recent announcement, but would expect between \$1 and \$2 million
- This funding is supplemental to annual Expenditures averaging approximately \$10 million annually on HVAC renewal and upgrades











Leased Space

- Funding no additional funding;
- Schools are generally purpose built;
- Most leased space would require considerable retrofit to meet school requirements;
- Additional planning for supervision, staffing, safety and transportation;
- Timing makes this challenging.











Shifting Landscape
